

Reaches growers across multiple states

Commercial fruit and vegetable growers face many uncertainties. The 2023 Southern Illinois Fruit and Vegetable School in Mt. Vernon on February 8 featured four tracks to address vegetable, small fruit, tree fruit, and flower production. The day provided informative, practical, and up-to-date research-based information to address the challenges of growing fruit and vegetables commercially in Southern Illinois.

In between sessions, growers had the opportunity to visit with leading industry experts and vendors. The event drew 125 attendees, with 39 participants in the flower track that was spearheaded by Horticulture Educator Christina Lueking.

Tree fruit and vegetable school is an annual program that draws growers from all over Illinois and Missouri. Starting in 2024 local Extension staff will be taking the lead on this project.




New Year-New Workshops
